A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than ""SU"" or ""UAVG"" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example:

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PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

State Adopted Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SA"" identifier indicate that the prevailing wage rate set by a state (or local) government was adopted under 29 C.F.R 1.3(g)-(h). Example: SAME2023-007 01/03/2024. SA reflects that the rates are state adopted. ME refers to the State of Maine. 2023 is the year during which the state completed the survey on which the listed classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 01/03/2024 reflects the date on which the classifications and rates under the ?SA? identifier took effect under state law in the state from which the rates were adopted.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour National Office because National Office has responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

1.1 MOBILIZATION

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT: Mobilization shall be measured by lump sum. Mobilization shall be paid at the contract unit price bid. Payment shall include material, labor, equipment, and other incidentals as specified in contract. Mobilization shall be paid at no more than 50% at start of construction and monthly thereafter based on progress. Payment for de-mobilization shall occur only after the close out documents are received. Mobilization cannot exceed 5% of the total work order cost.

Payment shall include reinstallation of meter box, angle valve, five foot (5') of service line on the house side of the meter, connection to the service lines on both sides of the installation, installation of the meter/AMR (complete), excavation, backfill, site restoration, permitting fees and all other material, labor, and equipment required to make a complete water meter installation.

1.4 EXISTING WATER LINE TO BE CAPPED AND PLUGGED

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT: Existing water line to be capped and plugged shall be measured by lump sum. Payment for water line to be capped and plugged shall include excavation, trench safety, mechanical cap, concrete blocking, backfill, site restoration, equipment, material and labor necessary to cap and plug the existing water line complete in place.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT: Potholing City and Private water service shall be measured by each water service potholed. Pothole 5' on both sides of the meter and at existing Starview water line connection if material is galvanized, identify and record pipe material and meter coordinates, and site restoration. This item also includes neatly logging in a "City Approved Inspection Sheet" all public and private service line materials and meter coordinates for each service line furnished.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT: Replace service lines shall be measured by linear feet for each service line replaced and accepted by the Owner. All service line installation work is to be done in accordance with the Specification for Water Service Installation.
