A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MIDWEST CITY, OKLAHOMA IN SUPPORT OF SOONER INVESTMENT'S APPLICATION TO ACCESS U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY'S COMMUNITY-WIDE BROWNFIELDS GRANT FUNDS FOR TESTING AND POSSIBLE REMEDIATION OF COMMERCIAL SITES WITHIN THE SOUTHEAST 15TH STREET CORRIDOR.

WHEREAS, completion of the project linked to Sooner's application will help beautify the northern entrance to Rose State College and help to improve the quality of life for its staff and students; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the city of Midwest City, Oklahoma does hereby support of Sooner Investment's application to the OCC to access U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Grant funds and any other valuable assistance as a means to help clear the way for redevelopment in the Southeast 15th Street corridor;
